Safe ID Storage

You've spend time and money getting your Identification, so you know what it's worth. Not all ID needs to be with you at all times, and having a safe place to keep it can give you peace of mind.

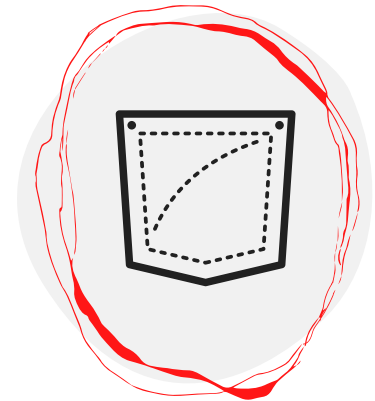
UNSAFE STORAGE

Only your most essential pieces of ID (e.g. your BC Services Card or Drivers' License and a bank card) should be carried with you.

Wallets can be picked from your pocket, left on a chair or table, or taken from your space when you aren't looking.

Keeping a loose card in your pocket is even riskier, since you're unlikely to feel if it falls out.

Unless you have a locked spot that only you can open, the best place to keep ID such as your Social Insurance Card, Birth Certificate, or Passport is in a safe storage site.



SAFE STORAGE

The Salvation Army offers no-cost secure ID storage that you can access as needed. Your ID will be stored in a folder with your name on it and kept under lock and key.
